

These powerful words from Jesus, our model Servant-Leader, are the standard for us who follow Him.





1. Born Again

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation (2 Cor. 5:17).

The most important and most thrilling discovery in life is finding the way home to God. The way is simple and clear.



God's heart toward you — Love.

As the Creator of everything, God is perfect and holy. His great heart of love loves you. He wants to cleanse you of your sins. He longs to give you peace of mind and heart, purpose for living and assurance of eternity in heaven with Him.

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life (Jn. 3:16).

This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins (1 Jn. 4:10).



Your need for God — Forgiveness and Fellowship.

Your greatest need is to be forgiven by God and restored to fellowship with Him. Humanity's rebellion against God has cut our relationship with Him. This rebellion is the root of all sin and has produced all the sadness in our world.

We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all (Isa. 53:6).

For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Ro. 3:23).



God's provision for you — Jesus Christ.

We cannot reach God by our own efforts or good works. Jesus Christ is God in human flesh. He is the eternal Son of God. His death is the sacrifice God accepts to pay for all our sins. Three days after His death, He physically came back to life, triumphing over sin, death and hell. As God's only provision for sin, He offers forgiveness and new life to you, right now!

Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (Jn. 14:6).

For there is one God and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus (1 Tim. 2:5).



Your commitment to Christ — Repentance and faith.

Committing yourself to Christ involves turning away from your old way of living. In turning to Christ you turn from all your sins and all your efforts to save yourself. This commitment means trusting fully in Jesus' death for you as the only payment ever needed for your sins. Since Jesus purchased you with His blood, you now transfer ownership of your life to Him. The time to make this commitment is now!

... to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God (In. 1:12).

That if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your beart that God raised bim from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your beart that you believe and are justified and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved...for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved" (Ro. 10:9,10,13).

Make this the prayer of your heart right now: Lord Jesus, thank You for dying on the cross for me. Right now, I repent of my sins and trust Your shed blood as the full payment for all my sins. I believe that You are the Son of God and that God has raised You from the dead. I now receive You as my personal Savior and commit my life to You as my Lord. Thank You for hearing my prayer, forgiving my sins and coming into my life as You promised. Amen.

If you prayed this prayer sincerely and in faith, welcome to the family of God! Jesus Christ has promised to come into your life when, in repentance and faith, you invite Him to be your Lord.

And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. He who has the Son has life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life (1 Jn. 5:11,12).

2. Discipleship

But grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be the glory both now and forever. Amen (2 Pe. 3:18).

Congratulations! You have made the most important and exciting decision of your life. There is nothing more wonderful than establishing a personal relationship with God. By committing your life to Jesus Christ, the Bible says you are now

born again (1 Pe. 1:23) saved (Ro. 10:13) redeemed (1 Pe. 1:18,19)

Whenever doubts try to rob your assurance, remember ...

- Salvation is not your accomplishment but His accomplishment. Jesus cried out on the cross, "It is finished!" (John 19:30). The price for your salvation has been paid in full by His blood.
- You can trust God's promises. The Bible gives wonderful promises to those who put their faith in Christ. Read these promises in Titus 1:2, John 5:24, John 10:9, John 10:28,29 and Hebrews 13:5.
- Don't trust your feelings. Your hope of eternal life isn't determined by your feelings. Your faith is grounded in a settled fact – Jesus died for you and rose again. So when in doubt, doubt your doubts and trust God's promises.

Jesus will help you continue to grow. He will keep working with you, making you more like Him each day as you trust in Him. Being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus (Phil. 1:6).

Now that you are His, there are clear steps to growth in your walk with Jesus.

1. Confess your faith in Christ publicly.

Major decisions in life are almost always announced publicly. Whenever Jesus called someone to follow Him, He always called that person publicly. By declaring your allegiance to Jesus, you announce to the world that you are not ashamed to acknowledge Him as Lord of your life. This public confession helps seal your decision.

Jesus said, "Whoever acknowledges me before men, I will also acknowledge him before my Father in Heaven. But whoever disowns me before men, I will disown him before my Father in heaven" (Mt. 10:32).

2. Follow Christ in water baptism.

Your baptism is a public statement of your faith. You are declaring that you have died to the old way of life and have risen to walk in newness of life in Christ. Your baptism is also a wonderful opportunity to share your faith in Jesus Christ with family and friends.

We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life (Ro. 6:4).

3. Ask the Holy Spirit to fill and control you.

The Holy Spirit is the Comforter Jesus promised to bring to His followers. The Holy Spirit lives inside us as Christians, giving us the power to live lives that please God. His fruit, gifts and power are available to us by faith.

Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit (Epb. 5:18).

4. Turn away from every known sin.

We can live holy lives by the power of God's Spirit who lives in us. Immediately, whenever God reveals to us any words, attitudes or actions that dishonor Him, we should

acknowledge our sin and fully repent. As we walk in His light, our fellowship with Jesus stays strong and we grow ever closer to Him.

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness (1 Jn. 1:9).

5. Unite with a Christ-centered local church.

Fellowship with other believers is vital for your Christian growth. We are strengthened by fellowship and worship together, and we also strengthen others. Faithful involvement with a Christ-honoring church will allow you the privilege of serving and giving to Christ and His people.

And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds. Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another – and all the more as you see the Day approaching (Heb. 10:24,25).

6. Serve Christ by serving people.

As followers of Jesus, we are to live a life of service for others. Instead of focusing on your own needs, let your focus be on the Lord and on people you can minister to in His name. By giving yourself for God and for others, you will be a growing servant-leader.

... whoever wants to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many (Mark 10:44,45).

7. Open up to God through the Bible.

Don't let a day go by without reading, studying and meditating on God's Word, the Bible. The Bible is God's love letter to you. Through its pages God speaks to you –

guiding, warning, correcting and expressing His love. Look around you. Everything you see is wearing away – except the Word of God. God's Word endures forever (see Isa. 40:8).

Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path (Psa. 119:105).

8. Develop your prayer life.

There is no higher privilege on earth than communion with God. Because of the blood of Jesus, we have direct access to God anytime, anywhere. You can begin today by using the model prayer Jesus taught in Matthew 6:9-13. As you pray, believe God for answers. You can be a world-changer through prayer!

Call to me and I will answer you and tell you great and unsearchable things you do not know (Jer. 33:3).

9. Introduce others to Jesus.

What an honor it is to represent Jesus Christ! Millions of people all over the world are hungry to know God. They are ready to receive Christ – if only someone will point the way to Him. Be sensitive today to opportunities to share your love for Christ and your faith in Him. There is great joy in introducing someone else to Jesus.

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth (Ac. 1:8).

10. Trust God's promises.

God is pleased when we live by faith, trusting what He has said. God has given us the promise of His presence (Heb. 13:5), the promise of His purpose (Ro. 8:28,29), the promise of His provision (Phil. 4:19), and the promise of His power (1 Cor. 10:13).

We live by faith, not by sight (2 Cor. 5:7).

3. Character

And David shepherded them with integrity of heart; with skillful hands he led them (Psa. 78:72).

If we could pray one prayer for you as a servant-leader, we would pray that God would give you a fruitful, God-honoring ministry until Jesus returns. The Bible describes qualities we can cultivate that will guarantee an effective, productive life in service for Christ. Also, growing in these qualities assures us that we will never fall away from our love for Jesus (see 2 Pe. 1:8-11). God has given us "everything we need for life and godliness through our knowledge of him" (2 Pe. 1:3). Rely on the Holy Spirit to change you and cooperate with Him by cultivating these character qualities each day.

1. Faith.

Add to your faith ... (2 Pe. 1:5).

Faith is the bedrock of character because faith is simply trusting God and His promises. Do not allow your mind to develop thought patterns of unbelief.

2. Goodness.

Add to your faith goodness (2 Pe. 1:5).

This means moral excellence. It means being above reproach and not falling victim to the abuse of money, sex or power. Deal ruthlessly with every sin and cultivate a single-hearted devotion to Jesus. A person of integrity is a whole person; there is no difference between what he appears to be in public and who he really is in private.

3. Knowledge.

And to goodness, knowledge (2 Pe. 1:5).
Jesus said we are to love God with all our mind (Matt. 22:37). God wants us to keep growing – body, mind and

spirit. Continue to read, keep asking questions, and *thirst* for knowledge and wisdom.

4. Self-control.

And to knowledge, self-control (2 Pe. 1:6). Many people today are overcome with rage and anger. By the power of the Holy Spirit we can keep our emotions and actions under control and not take part in destructive thinking or actions. Our legitimate appetites are to be brought under the Spirit's control, as well. True meekness,

as perfectly displayed by Jesus, is strength under control.

5. Perseverance.

And to self-control, perseverance (2 Pe. 1:6). It is always too soon to be discouraged. No matter how difficult your circumstances may be, never, never, never lose your faith! To win the race, you must stay in the race! Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that binders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. Let us fix our eyes on Jesus ... (He. 12:1,2).

6. Godliness.

And to perseverance, godliness (2 Pe. 1:6). Godliness is not self-righteousness. In fact, it is the very opposite. Godliness means cultivating God's life in us, drawing upon the power of His Spirit. It is to experience the "exchanged life" – exchanging all that we are not for all that Jesus Christ is. As we yield to Him, we are literally being conformed into the likeness of Christ (Ro. 8:29).

7. Brotherly kindness.

And to godliness, brotherly kindness (2 Pe. 1:7). God calls on us to exhibit a quality that people are starved to receive – kindness. Your compassionate touch, your word or note of encouragement, the prayers you offer for

a friend in need – in God's eyes, these simple acts may be the most important things you do today. In a world seething with competitiveness, your kindness will really stand out!

8. Love. And to brotherly kindness, love (2 Pe. 1:7). Love should be the compelling force behind all we do. It is the greatest of all the Christian virtues. The love of Christ is part of the fruit of the Spirit that God will develop in us as we trust Him. God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us (Ro. 5:5).

Wherever you are right now, stop for a moment and commit to cultivating these eight character qualities in your life. Yield to the Holy Spirit and allow Him to produce His fruit in you. All servant-leaders are growing and maturing in character.

May God himself, the God of peace, sanctify you through and through. May your whole spirit, soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls you is faithful and he will do it (1 Thes. 5:23,24).

4. Commitment

... choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve ... But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord (Joshua 24:15).

The following statement was found next to a pastor in Zimbabwe who was beaten to death for his faith in Christ:

I am part of the fellowship of the unashamed. I have Holy Spirit power. The die has been cast. I have stepped over the line. The decision has been made. I'm a disciple of His. I won't look back, let up, slow down, back away or be still.

My past is redeemed, my present makes sense, my future is secure. I'm finished and done with sight walking, small planning, smooth knees, colorless dreams, tamed vision, mundane talking, cheap giving, and dwarfed goals.

I no longer need preeminence, prosperity, position, promotions, plaudits, or popularity. I don't have to be right, first, tops, recognized, praised, regarded, or rewarded. I now live by faith, lean on His presence, walk by patience, am lifted by prayer, and labor by power.

My face is set, my gait is fast, my goal is heaven, my road is narrow, my way rough, my Guide reliable, my mission clear. I cannot be bought, compromised, detoured, lured away, turned back, deluded, or delayed. I will not flinch in the face of sacrifice, hesitate in the presence of adversity, negotiate at the table of the enemy, ponder at the pool of popularity, or meander in the maze of mediocrity.

I won't give up, shut up, let up, until I have stayed up, stored up, prayed up, preached up, for the cause of Christ. I am a disciple of Jesus. I must go until He comes, give until I drop, preach until all know, and work until He stops me. And when He comes for His own, He will have no problem recognizing me – my banner will be clear.

5. Calling

Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart; I appointed you as a prophet to the nations (Jer. 1:5).

When God called Jeremiah to be His representative, he hesitated, fearing he was incapable and, perhaps, unworthy. Jeremiah also felt he did not have the necessary speaking skills. "Ah, Sovereign Lord, I do not know how to speak; I am only a child" (Jer. 1:6).

Immediately God corrected the young man's thinking. "Do not say, 'I am only a child.' You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you" (Jer. 1:7).

God is still calling prophets today to proclaim His message to the nations. Perhaps, like Jeremiah, you know God is calling you. But you may also feel you are not qualified. God wants to change your thinking! You have been called into the kingdom for just such a time as this (see Esth. 4:14). God's grace, His enablement, will more than make up for any lack.

These five faith declarations, based on the call of God to Jeremiah, are designed to help you understand that you are not inadequate – you are called to take His message to your generation. Each faith statement is packed with confidence in God's ability. Study each faith statement prayerfully. Boldly declare them, out loud. Say them until you believe them, deep inside. Then step out in confidence to mark your generation for Jesus Christ.

Faith declaration one: "I am important to the kingdom of God. Therefore, I will act like an ambassador."

Never again say you are "only a child." In other words, don't ever say you are insignificant or unimportant. *You*

are important to the advance of the gospel and the building of God's kingdom. God has certain things He wants done in this generation and He has chosen you to accomplish them through His strength. You represent the interests of Jesus Christ on the earth, so don't underestimate your importance to God's kingdom.

The Bible says that we are Christ's ambassadors (2 Cor. 5:20). As ambassadors, we represent heaven's interests and we carry the authority of God's kingdom. Because we are ambassadors, we must conduct ourselves in a manner worthy of our calling.

You are valuable to God and His purposes because you are made in the image of God, because of the great price Jesus paid for your redemption, and because there is something God wants done that *only you can do*.

Faith declaration two: "God's word is in my mouth. Therefore, I will speak with confidence."

Then the Lord reached out his hand and touched my mouth and said to me, "Now, I have put my words in your mouth" (Jer. 1:9). Has God called you as His messenger? Then He has put His words in your mouth. You are to speak His message without fear, without apology and without hesitation. Concerning those who preach, the Bible says, If anyone speaks, he should do it as one speaking the very words of God (1 Pe. 4:11). When we deliver God's Word, we should expect God to act. His word will do its work. Is not my word like fire, says the Lord, and like a hammer that breaks a rock in pieces? (Jeremiah 23:29).

To be effective in ministry, you must be fully convinced of the power of the gospel, the power of the name of Jesus, the power of the blood of Jesus, the power of the Holy Spirit, and the power of God's word. For the word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged

sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart (He. 4:12).

Faith declaration three: "God's work is my work. Therefore, I will be a diliaent worker."

God told Jeremiah to get up and begin to work as His prophet. It's time to get up and be about God's business. Time is a precious asset. The Psalmist prayed, "Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom" (Psa. 90:12). The Bible urges us, "Be very careful, then, how you live – not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil" (Eph. 5:15,16).

Faith declaration four: "Revelation is my qualification. Therefore, I will pray."

God asked Jeremiah, "What do you see?" He is asking you the same thing today – "What is your vision? What is your revelation?" Revelation is the word God wants you to deliver to the people, and that revelation only comes in His presence. That is why prayer is so vital.

While a great education may not be available to everyone, great *revelation* is as close as the place of prayer. Many factors contribute to success in ministry, but the greatest qualification for effectiveness is to hear from God and boldly obey what you hear.

Faith declaration five: "I must sow in order to reap. Therefore, I will sow in faith."

Find a way, everyday, to give something to God and something to people. Sow your time. Sow your love. Sow a word of encouragement or an hour in prayer. Sow the good seed of the word of God. And, yes, sow your money. As you sow, sow in faith. Begin giving now.

6. Leadership

You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave – just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many (Mt. 20:25-28).

The first five chapters of the Book of Joshua provide ten important principles for effective spiritual leadership.

Don't live in the past.

Moses my servant is dead (Josb. 1:2). This is a new day in ministry! It requires new methods. God's word never changes, but our methods must constantly change. Leaders do not live in the past; they live in the present and the future.

2. Walk out your inheritance.

I will give you every place where you set your foot (Josh. 1:3). Every Christian has a "realm" of influence for Christ, and your area of potential impact may be much larger than you realize. Don't settle on a small corner of your spiritual inheritance; explore the very limits of the influence God has given you.

3. Be bold in the face of opposition. No one will be able to stand up against you all the days of your life (Josh. 1:5). As a leader you should expect opposition but you can be bold, knowing that God has given you the victory.

4. Be assured of God's presence.

As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will never leave you nor forsake you (Josh. 1:5). No matter where you are, no matter what you do, God is with you! You can live confidently because you know God is with you and for you. Claim the promise of God's presence. Emmanuel – God is with us!

5. Always be courageous.

Be strong and very courageous (Josb. 1:6,7,9). Leadership requires courage. As a leader you will make difficult decisions. Some of your decisions will be unpopular. Yet even in the midst of conflict and challenges, you can always exhibit courage, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go!

Obey God's word.

Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful (Josh. 1:8). Here is God's formula for success – confess, meditate on and obey God's word, the Bible.

7. Take a big step of faith.

That day the Lord exalted Joshua (Josh. 4:14). The day that Joshua dared to put his foot in the Jordan River, the day he took charge and modeled courage for the people to get beyond what had always blocked them from their inheritance, on that day, God exalted Joshua in the sight of all the people. What "Jordan" seems impassable to you? Take a big step of faith.

8. Let your life be marked by God.

Today I have rolled the reproach of Egypt from you (Josh. 5:9). As a careful surgeon, the Holy Spirit wants to cut away anything that would disqualify us from effective leadership. God wants to mark our

lives in such a profound way that we will never be mistaken for a person who is not in a covenant relationship with Him. Allow the Holy Spirit to mark you as a covenant person. This spiritual surgery may be painful, but it is necessary before we can truly represent the Lord on the fields of spiritual conflict.

9. Think in terms of abundance.

There was no longer any manna ... but that year they ate of the produce of Canaan (Josh. 5:12). Manna was "just enough." When it was consumed, nothing was left. God wants you to stop being only a consumer and also become a producer! As a mature believer, provision may not just "drop out of heaven" any longer. You must participate with God in receiving provision, even going into dangerous territory. As people in covenant with God, we are blessed in order to bless others, even blessing all the peoples of the earth (see Genesis 12:1-3).

10. Have a fresh encounter with the Commander.

"As commander of the army of the Lord I have now come" (Josh. 5:14). Before we go out to take territory for God, we need a fresh encounter with our Commander, the Lord Jesus Christ. In God's army there is only one commander. Although God calls us to be leaders, we follow in His footsteps and we are under His absolute authority.

When Joshua realized that he was on holy ground, he took off his shoes as a sign of reverence and honor for the Commander. May reverence for our Commander mark our lives, as well.

6a. ASKING ... personal questions and avoiding "small talk"

These are proven questions. A word of warning: These questions are intended for use with a person with whom you would like to have a serious conversation. To ask these questions of a total stranger ... the minute you meet, would obviously be unwise.

Note: these questions can be asked in any order you like.

- If you could do anything you wanted, if God told you that you were free to choose, and you had all the time, money, staff, education, etc. you needed, and you knew for certain that you couldn't fail, what would you do?
- Is something heavy on your shoulders today? What transitions (stressful) are you experiencing? If I could remove one burden from your shoulders today, what would it be?
- 3. What three principles would you say are most responsible for your success?
- What surprised you most about _____? What do you like best about ______?
- 5. What five milestones / turning points have most shaped your life to this point?
- 6. What three people do you admire most? Why?
- 7. Where do you see yourself ten years from now?
- 8. What causes 80% of your frustration, tension, and pressure? Why? What brings you 80% of your pleasure, joy, fun? Why?
- 9. What is the key to understanding the real you that most people miss?
- 10. What have been the three highlights and three hurts in your life? What are your three hopes for the future?

6b. DECIDING ... when a risky, pressurized, costly decision needs to be made

I help people make decisions involving large amounts of money each year. Many of these decisions are made under great time pressure. These are the actual questions I ask. It is often helpful to write out the answers.

- At its essence, in one sentence, what decision am I facing? What is the "bottom, bottom" line? Who, what, when, where, why, how, how much?
- 2. Have I given myself 24 hours to let this decision settle in my mind? Am I thinking about this decision with a clear head, or am I fatigued to the point where I shouldn't be making major decisions? How do we really feel about this decision? What questions are lingering in our minds that are unresolved? (List these.) Do I have "peace of mind" as I pray about it, and look at it from God's eternal perspective?
- 3. What would happen if we did not do what we are planning to do?
- 4. What difference will this decision make, 5-10-50-100 years from now?
- 5. What are the key assumptions we're making? What do we assume it will really cost? What do we assume will be its real benefits?

- 7. Should we seek outside counsel on this decision? As we each make a list of our top 3 most respected and wisest advisors, what would each probably advise us to consider in making this decision? How do our spouses and families feel about this decision? How are they are affected by it? Have we verified what the results have been for others as they have made this decision? Have we checked references? Have we actually interviewed previous users of the product or service? (Have we done our due diligence?)

- 8. What are our very best one to three options? Can the big decision be broken into sub-parts and lower risk decisions be made at a few "go, no go" points along the way?
- 9. Is this what we would do if we had twice the budget? ... Half the budget? ... Five times as much time? ... A tenth the time? ... Twice as many staff people? ... Half as many staff?
- 10. Is this the best timing? If not now, when? Why not? If someone held a loaded gun to my head and forced me to decide in the next two minutes, what would I decide? Why?

SINGLE WORD FOCUS:

What three land mines or roadblocks need my immediate attention? What have I been praying most about in the past 30 days? What three changes could reduce my "risk" by 50%?

7. QUARTERLY FOCUS

6d. ORGANIZING ... your life to maximize your time!

PERSONAL ORGANIZATION is having "a place for everything and everything in its place." There are four basic tools required for you to "have a place for everything and everything in its place."

- * A "TO DO" LIST ... to keep track of your commitments and responsibilities
- * A CALENDAR ... to keep track of commitments which are time sensitive
- * A FILE SYSTEM ... that helps you find where you put something
- * AN ADDRESS BOOK ... to keep track of your network

There is also the art of weeding out, eliminating, quitting, stopping what you should not be trying to organize. These are the things which tend to keep us feeling disorganized.

- 9. What 3 things could I do in the next 90 days to make a 50% difference this year?
- 10. What are the top 6 things I need to do today? What are the top 6 for tomorrow?

6e. PLANNING ... any organization or a major project

A master plan is a written statement of a group's assumptions about its direction, organization, and cash. ("All miscommunication is the result of differing assumptions" – Dr. Jerry Ballard.) Having a plan in writing drastically reduces the number of differing assumptions, thereby reducing team frustrations, pressures and tensions.

This simple six step process (**D.O.C.T.O.R.**) has been the foundation of Masterplanning Group's consulting since 1976.

D - DIRECTION:

- 1. What needs (outside of our organization) are we deeply concerned about, and uniquely qualified to meet?
- 2. Why are we doing what we are doing? (Purpose statement)
- 3. In what areas (divisions or departments) will we be doing work in over the years?
- 4. If we could only accomplish 3 measurable priorities (goals reached or problems solved) in each of the above areas:
- ... in the next ten years ... which would make a 50% difference in our lifetime.

... in the next year ... which would make a 50% difference in ten years,

... in the next 90 days ... which would make a 50% difference this coming year,

what would we do?

O - ORGANIZATION:

5. Who is responsible for what? (Position descriptions) Who is responsible for whom? (Organizational chart) Do we have the right people in the right place? (Executive assessment)

C - CASH

- 6. What are our projected income, expenses, net?
- 7. Can we afford this plan? How can we afford it?

T - TRACKING

8. Are we on target? (Reporting)

O - OVERALL EVALUATION

9. Are we achieving the quality we expect and demand of ourselves?

R - REFINEMENT

10. How can we refine our way towards the ideal based on the above evaluations?

Year after year your team can use these same questions to focus your team's planning retreats, regardless of how large your organization becomes.

6f. PERSPECTIVE UNDER PRESSURE!

- Focus on a "triple win!" Don't negotiate (where you get more and others get less). Look for solutions where you win, the other person wins, and those you serve win!
- In this situation see yourself as "God's student" not "life's victim."
- 6. Nothing motivates like results!
- 7. Prayer gives you God's perspective on your problems.
- 8. Time perspective: What difference will what we are doing make in ... 1 year ... 3 years ... 10 years ... 15 years ... 30 years ... 100 years ... Eternity?
- 9. Treat team members like sisters, brothers, mothers, fathers.
- 10. What is ideal ... long term?
- 11. "What 3 steps could we take in the next 90 days to make a 50% difference?" (Steve Douglass).
- 12. What is currently working ... and not working?

6q. SPEAKING WITHOUT FEAR

COMFORTING REALITIES:

- Being dressed appropriately for the occasion ...This adds confidence.
- At first the audience judges you by your appearance. When they leave they judge you by your heart.
- Knowing the material extremely well adds speaking confidence.
- In God's sovereignty, exactly the number of people who are supposed to be here are here and this is the day they are to hear what you have to say.

FOCUS:

- Focus on how much you love the audience. *Perfect love drives out fear (1 Jn. 4:18).*
- Focus on the "single word" that represents the essence of your entire talk.
- Focus your thinking on what your material will mean to your audience and how it will help them. Don't focus on how they may or may not respond to you.
- Focus more on communicating and connecting with the audience than on each and every detail of your material.

REMIND YOURSELF BEFORE YOU SPEAK:

• I am here to love, serve, instruct, inspire ... not to impress!

YOUR TALK:

- Memorize your first line ... to sound confident at the start ... and give you time to get a little more comfortable with your audience.
- Start talks with an attention getting question (getting your audience focused on your question more than focused on you), or a very specific story (establishing time and place) and let their imagination work to take their attention off of you and onto your story.
- Find your own style of humor. If you are not good at telling jokes stay away from them. Go with your natural humor style ... or stay away.
- Make a list of those stories, illustrations and outlines that "always communicate."
- Think through the 1-3 passion points of your talk and deliver

them with strength ... loud/soft/visual ... but deliver them with strength!

- Give the audience a specific thing they can do with your talk when they get back home. Give an assignment ... an action point ... a practical application ... something specific to do because of your talk.
- End with a great story that illustrates your entire talk. Stop your talk with a major "bang," not a "whimper." Don't just stop and sit down.
